

Please also note the enclosed Checklist for Style.

Please send us a revision of your manuscript within 3 months of receiving this letter. If you are unable to do so, we will remove your manuscript from the review process. Any subsequent revision would then be regarded as a new submission. Please notify us in regard to your intent to revise the manuscript and approximately when we can expect to receive it.
