Thanks for your note. I have received the faxed copyright agreement for Carri Hill. There are two outstanding items that need to be resolved, however. They are:

(a) Moving the sentence to the Discussion or deleting it altogether, which would require removing a couple of the citations (i.e., Dumka... 1997 and Irvine... 1999) in the reference list (I will do this).

(b) Citing the source (publication you sent to us) for Table 2 in a table note at the bottom of the table (I will do this) and **obtaining permission to reproduce or adapt the material**. I assume JAPNA holds the copyright, correct? We would need a permission letter.
